

Feast Day 2016

In its modern form the Feast has been running for over 40 years and still to this day attracts substantial crowds of current and returning 'Waterbeachians', families and friends. It is with sadness that we report the loss of our President Peter James Gillson who died on March 25th 2016. Peter was a loyal supporter of the Legion which he joined on discharge in 1946 after war services in the 2nd World War. Peter was "Mentioned in Despatches" for bravery

Your local Royal British Legion branch is looking for new members ex-service or non-ex-service people are eligible for full membership. The Legion recognise the support given to it but it also like other voluntary organisations requires the volunteers to run it. The last National Serviceman is now over 75 and all ex-service since 1960 have been Regulars (men & women) and most of them have seen active service around the world. Some have serious medical conditions for which the Legion assist them and their families. Every person who has served for over 7 days is entitled to Legion support for which there is a dedicated telephone number 0808 802 8080 and support will be given via this confidential line.

The Legion Branch owns this property on a Trust account and to ensure the continuity of the club it is necessary the Legion branch continues. Should the branch close the Legion National Trustees have a duty to manage the property in the best interest of the Trust in regards the Legion and its work. District Councillor's Report

It seems like a long time since the election in May! I have had an enjoyable few months learning the ropes, going to meetings and getting stuck into case work.

Repair Café - I'm really pleased to let you know that a Repair Café will be held at Waterbeach Salvation Army Hall on 22nd October from 10am-1pm. This is the first time 'Circular Cambridge' have arranged one for our village. You can bring along the following to be repaired: small household appliances & electrical items, computers, mobile phones, bicycles, clothes (clean!), and general bits and bobs. The repairers are experienced and can fix most things, but there are no guarantees. The work is free, but donations to cover venue hire and other costs are welcome.

You can turn up on the day, or pre-book your item in by emailing waterbeach@repaircafe.org.uk.

Amey Site - I am aware that the smell from the Amey site near Chittering is quite noticeable on some days. I attended the public liaison meeting in July, and will be making another visit for a closer look at the facilities in September. Please report odour from the site to the Environment Agency Hotline: 0800 607080. They log the calls, and will act every time the number of complaints passes a certain threshold.

Handyperson Service - South Cambs District Council, in partnership with Mears, are now offering a 'Handyperson Service' for tenants of the council in sheltered housing. They can undertake minor joinery, gardening, plumbing and general DIY support. All materials must be provided by the tenant. The charge is £10 per half hour. To arrange an appointment, call 0800 085 1313.

Urban & Civic - Peter Johnson and I have agreed to meet with U&C regularly to keep up to date with the issues arising regarding the barracks land. The next stage in the development will be another consultation with local residents. U&C will share the layout and designs for the future area, and seek feedback on the proposals before they are finalised for submission in an Outline Planning Application. Please make a note of the dates and come forward to make sure your views are heard. If you are a member of a club or society, make time to discuss what facilities or other provision could be relevant to you in the future. Consultation sessions are: 29th & 30th September 3pm-8pm and 1st October 10am-4pm.

Oliver had put so much faith, time and effort getting it to a point when it could open twice a month and by appointment. We offer our deepest condolences to Oliver's partner Luca sister Judith, nephew's cousins and many friends.

Without Oliver's, and others, determination to save the museum for the community and those who flew from, served and worked at Waterbeach Station/Barracks since 1940, this local historical story could not be told so we owe him particular thanks. Oliver was keen to support 514 Squadron's reunions and welcome people visiting the museum on an ad hoc basis. His knowledge was boundless and his enthusiasm infectious.

We have a group of dedicated trustees and volunteers who will continue to open the museum, add and care for the collection. Interestingly WMHM is being offered items from both RAF and RE days of occupation quite often.

The trustees are indebted for this generosity and will use any gifts for something specific for the improvement of the museum displays, in his memory.

Retd. former station commander who in 1984 organised the opening of the original museum, Peter Groves The Royal British Legion, Clive Hill 514 reunion organiser, Dave Hornby Major Retd. former officer at Waterbeach and museum curator until he handed the museum over to the trustees, Peter Johnson District and Parish Councillor, Alan Shipp Treasurer, Robert Stripe from Landbeach and Adrian Wright Chairman.

The trustees would like to thank Waterbeach Community Association for the donation of a £200 start-up grant, this has proved very helpful.

Also thanks to Urban&Civic for allowing the museum back in to its old Building No. 3 and the generosity in preparing the museum and community rooms for community use.

Museum opening days are the first Wednesday and Sunday between March and October 11am to 4pm. Entrance is free but donations gratefully received.





News from Cllr. Peter Johnson

Firstly I would like to say congratulations to Ingrid Tregoing on being elected as South Cambs District Councillor and I am sure we will be able to work together for the good of our community.

Back Stile Footpath - There have been several complaints about this footpath as it is quite overgrown. The problem is that it falls to volunteers to clear it, but volunteers are thin on the ground. The last time it was cleared it was David Armstrong, my wife Brenda and myself, but we are all getting older

so need younger helpers coming forward. I have been able to enlist the help of AmeyCespa this time as they have a Community Working day for their staff where they come into the Community to do jobs such as this. It is planned that we get this work done week commencing 26th September and this will make the footpath a much more pleasant walk for all. We will need some volunteers to also help with this as there will be quite a lot of clearing up to be done so if you are willing and able please contact me. I will be able to confirm the exact date nearer the time.

Planning Issues - The Cody Road Morris Homes development has been rife with problems, but hopefully everything has been rectified now and bearing in mind we have three more developments going to take place on Bannold Road I hope that South Cambs Planning and Enforcement teams have learned from previous issues. Along with several others I attended the Planning Appeal hearing for the proposed development along Denny End Road which has been fiercely opposed, but to date I have not had the result of the appeal hearing.

Station Car Park - This issue continues to rumble on but headway is being made. Network Rail have said they would lease out the land with a rental of £12000 as it is or £25000 after it has been resurfaced and white lined. The County Council have shown an interest plus a private individual has also shown an interest so it would appear that we are getting closer to an extended car park. The next issue will be to encourage people to use it rather than park on the verge.

Street Lights - As most people are aware, the street lights get dimmed at 10pm and then at 2am go off apart from main roads. I have been asked by several elderly people if some lights could be left on. It is not because they want to go out during the night but to wake up and find everywhere dark they find it quite unnerving. It is possible to have some street lights kept on but the Parish Council will have to pay for this service and for the financial year 2016/2017 it is £7.70 per light, plus a one off admin charge of £65. Now in Waterbeach we have 358 street lights so obviously no-one can afford to keep all the lights on. I will be looking at areas where elderly and vulnerable people live and get the feelings of those residents and then get a list of possible lights for the Parish Council to consider. Anyone with suggestions please contact me.

Primrose Lane - The High Street to Denson Close stretch has been trimmed along with all the overgrown areas of Denson Close; this was a follow on action after I had an inspection with South Cambs officers. The top end of the lane is due to be trimmed on 9th September as this is quite badly overgrown. I have received some complaints about this and the trimming was not due to take place until the end of September but I have persuaded the council to do this earlier so the 9th it is.

Speed Watch - I did get a team together and we had a session but as it was a shared kit and other villages needed it and then it had to go away for calibration so our chance of more sessions have been extremely limited. But now we have another kit and once we get the holiday season out of the way I would like to arrange another session so I will be contacting previous volunteers and if anyone else is interested please give me a call.

Post Box - Well we did get the Post Box installed in the Denson Close/Waddelow Road area, it is not our original box and is quite tatty but I have asked the Post Office to give it a lick of paint which they have agreed to do. I am not sure when this will happen but I will remind them regularly until it is done.

Maple Court - The Silver Birch trees planted in the grounds of Maple Court have died and had to be removed but as part of their planning conditions these will have to be replaced. I have spoken to Sanctuary and they have agreed to do this when the time is right to plant new trees, which will again be Silver Birch but of a better quality.

Broken item? Don't throw it away - bring it to Waterbeach's first Repair Café! Repair Cafés are meeting places where neighbours can repair their broken items, supported by experienced repairers, in a relaxed, sociable atmosphere with a cup of tea. The first Repair Café was held in Amsterdam in 2009. Cambridge and Cottenham have had several over the last couple of years, and now there will be a repair café held in Waterbeach for the first time.

This will be held in the Salvation Army Hall, Station Road from 10 am to 1pm on Saturday 22 October.

Volunteer engineers and fixers will be on hand to help fix small household appliances, gadgets, electronics, bicycles, clothes and general bits and bobs. Broken items can be booked in by emailing waterbeach@repaircafe.org.uk with a short description of the item and the fault. You can also turn up with an item on the day, up to 12.30p.m. but bookings are strongly encouraged so that sufficient repairers are on hand.

The event is free. Donations are welcome to help cover costs.

Waterbeach School Governors

Would you make a good school governor? Waterbeach Community Primary School currently has vacancies for governors.

What do we do? The school Governing body is a group of volunteers who are involved in decisions about all aspects of managing the school – such as running buildings and budgets, supporting staff and setting standards. We also help to make big decisions about the school's long-term goals. We support Miss Green, but also ask questions and make sure that she, along with the Senior Leadership Team, takes the school in the right direction.

Who can be a school governor? Anyone over 18 can be a school governor – you don't have to be a parent with a child at the school. However, we do have a proportion of parent governors, and it can be a rewarding way to be involved in your child's school.

The most important qualities for being a governor are enthusiasm, commitment and an interest in education. You don't need teaching experience, but it's useful to bring skills from other areas of your life. You need to have time to dedicate to the role, be able to make good decisions and make sure that your decisions are followed up. As a governor you'll probably need to work eight to ten hours a month. At Waterbeach, you'll need to attend a governors' meeting each half term. You'll also be expected to join a sub-committee – these cover different areas like the curriculum, finance or performance management. You'll need to be able to work well in a team, as you'll be making joint decisions on policy.

How do I become a school governor? In the first instance, please contact the office (office@waterbeach.cambs.sch.uk or 01223 718988) and a current governor will contact you for an informal chat. Before you put yourself forward, talk to your employer. Many employers recognise the role of school governor as useful work experience and may offer paid leave for governor duties. It may even count towards your CPD.

Governing is a fantastic way of supporting our thriving school; come and join the largest volunteer force in the country! Looking forward to hearing from you.

We have recently received government funding to enable us to develop the Neighbourhood Plan.


We have appointed a consultant and an admin assistant to ensure the Plan evolves in a timely and transparent manner.

Library News

Waterbeach Library continues to increase membership weekly, and certainly the Reading Challenge has been very successful so far with many children signing up. The number to date is approximately 120 with more signing



up after returning from summer holidays. The children we have in this community are very eager to read, research and generally achieve high academic levels, assisted by the local community school. The Library assists wherever possible so to see such numbers signing up to the Reading Challenge is quite gratifying. The Challenge will continue until the children have returned for their new school year whereupon a date will be decided with the school as to when those who have completed the Reading Challenge will receive their medals and diplomas in morning assembly. Those children attending other schools will have their medals and diplomas delivered to their homes.

Waterbeach Library offers study areas, public computers, and assistance with using the computers. A small charge is made for printing facilities, and general advice is always available if required. We can order any book you may require from other libraries in the Cambridgeshire area, plus any books you obtain from other Cambridgeshire libraries can be dropped off at Waterbeach to be returned to same libraries, saving you a trip into town or back to original library. There is no charge for requesting books or returning same.

We are situated down the school drive, to the left - we have a large sign on the end of the building, access is suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs, we also have toilet facilities. Children and babies are always welcome, we are not a quiet Library - as one young man said "Waterbeach is not a shushie Library" - as in truth the Volunteers are probably noisier than any children!

We always need Volunteers so if you have two hours a week, fortnight or month to offer us we would love to meet you as anyone who loves books and likes people enjoys working at the Library. The computer is not hard to operate and we offer training to everyone.

Below is a down to earth piece about what it is like to be a Volunteer, written by a volunteer.

"A few hours from my week that is a mix of routine and perhaps a surprise in the company of usually at least one other volunteer.

So what might I do in those few hours of volunteering? After opening the building and window blinds there are three computers to turn on and the library system to log into. Then there is the letterbox to empty in which there

might be notices to display and books that have been returned when the library is closed to check in. There is the library phone to charge up and check for messages and a diary to look in for any special tasks that I might be able to do. Behind the counter there is a 'Holds' section to check for items requested that are past their collection date to be sent on. Aside from books coming back to shelve and going out someone might ask whether we have a particular book or something available for them by a particular writer, ask if there are any books new to the library, ask if they can request a book or ask the library to buy a book to add to the stock. Some people give books to the library which can be added to the library stock or offered for sale depending on the circumstances or simple use the computers.

Who pops into the Library? It could be absolutely anyone, from the site caretaker to check for any problems, adults with or without children, the postman, cyclists, people who have moved into the area, retired people with fascinating memories, children from playgroup or in school, career advisors and students.

No volunteer has to have any special knowledge, though we all find little things that we choose to do be it repairing books, adding new stock, weeding out tired copies, labelling, tidying shelves, and registering new users. Some of us never use the computer at all. The only thing needed from anyone is to welcome those that come into the library. We are very grateful to the youngsters who give us their time as part of their Duke of Edinburgh Award and have helped us throughout the busy Summer Reading Challenge."

So we hope you pop into the Library to check us out - we are a happy bunch, always welcoming, never dull and always pleased to see you.

Waterbeach Library is located in the Community Room on the Waterbeach School site. If you already have a Cambridgeshire Libraries card this can be used at Waterbeach, or you can join the Library there to enjoy the benefits of all Cambridgeshire Libraries. The Library is open Monday 10 - 12noon and 3 - 5pm, Wednesday 6 - 8pm, Friday 2 - 5.30pm and Saturday 10 - 12noon.

Tithe Barn Trust celebrate Charity Status

The Tithe Barn Trust is a not-for profit volunteer group aiming to save and sympathetically restore the 16th Century Grade II listed Tithe Barn, in Landbeach, for community use.

We were delighted to announce at our public Drinks Reception on Friday 17th June that we have received Charity status. Registered Charity Number 1167108.

James Hockney, Chair of the Tithe Barn Trust, says "Gaining charitable status for the Tithe Barn Trust was a major milestone,



which we just had to celebrate with our volunteers, supporters and the community." The event was a great success with Tudor style recipes, including Henry VIII's 'Maids of Honour' tarts and rosemary and oat nibbles to taste.

The event also kick-started a phased public consultation on what community use you would like to see for this Listed Tithe Barn, once it has been restored. Whilst we have raised over £64k, our major fundraising quest continues, as over £250k needs to be raised to fully restore this unique building.

We've been working hard; however, we still need your help to save this gem at the heart of Landbeach. We believe the Tudor Tithe barn, with thatched roof and 18th century brick floor, to be unique to Cambridgeshire and even of national significance. Over 90% of Tithe Barns have been developed. Tithe Barns hint at a different side of history, not just the story of the wealthy. It's a beautiful, untouched building, which deserves saving.

County Councillor's Report

Devolution, Mayors and "Who Is Responsible For ...?"

The consultation has just closed on the proposals for Devolution for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough – but what is it all about?

In an apparent reversal of the policies of all governments over the last three decades, George Osborne as Chancellor of the Exchequer decided that devolution would be a good idea. Devolution should mean that decisions about services are taken closer to the people they affect. It could mean councils being given back some of the powers and responsibilities that they used to have, but under the proposals being considered at present new, additional bodies are being set up instead.

Many local people have told me that they think the old system is confusing. Having Parish Councils, District Councils and the County Council leaves ordinary residents unsure who is responsible for what, and who they should contact if something needs doing. All of your local councillors try hard to be helpful when we receive an enquiry – but even we are sometimes unsure who to go to!

That system has evolved over recent years – by getting more complicated. The Police Committee was abolished on the creation of Police and Crime Commissioners, with a separate election for them. Schools were given the option of leaving Local Education Authority control by becoming Academies, and are now overseen by the Regional Schools Commissioner (though s/he is not elected). Councils used to have control of their budgets but now (apart from Parish Councils so far) their budgets are capped by Whitehall.

A fundamental change locally has been the creation of the Greater Cambridge City Deal. Although this does have three councillors on the Board of five members, and a further nine (three from each council, and I am one of the County Council representatives) on the advisory Assembly of 15 members, none of us are directly elected or directly accountable. As the City Deal has taken over responsibility for most of the big transport schemes in the Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire area this is a big deal – particularly for Waterbeach.

Whilst the South Cambridgeshire Local Plan (which is still being considered by the Planning Inspector at the moment) will say in broad terms what transport infrastructure projects are required as part of new developments in the village, it is the City Deal who are expected to draw up the schemes – including plans for improvements to the A10 to deal with the already increasing volume of traffic. This is a concern not least because of the dissatisfaction with the plans and consultation about Milton Road in Cambridge where the City Deal Board seem to be in a hurry to spend the

money allowed them by the government on measures both to reduce the capacity and increase the capacity of roads in Cambridge at the same time! The biggest concern of all about the devolution proposals is that in addition to the Parish, District and County Councils; and the Police and Crime, and Regional Schools Commissioners; and the City Deal Board and City Deal Assembly; a new Combined Authority and an elected Mayor, who will have to paid for, are now being proposed. It is hard to see how this is going to make things easier for local people to know who to hold accountable for decisions that affect them.

Hopefully most residents will have received our newsletter, with a full update on the facilities on site which are now in regular use by community groups, and our progress in moving the development of the Barracks and former airfield forward. If you did not then please do get in touch and we will happily drop a copy off to you. You can also see an electronic version on our website at www.waterbeachbarracks.co.uk.

We will be holding our next round of consultation and engagement on the future of the site in the Autumn, and opening it up for people to see the current facilities as well as to feed back on the latest evolution of the plans. These have drawn on the workshops and discussions held so far with the local community, local partners and authorities, as well as our forensic surveying and research of the site and local area. We want your feedback on the thinking so far, to ensure you have a chance to shape the development that comes forward, and so that we make sure it maximises the benefits to local people and businesses and minimises negative impacts.

The event will include information on the planned transport investment and solutions; the extensive community facilities coming forward, such as schools and health centre; and will seek views on the green space and park areas planned, including around the former runway and lakes; as well as housing design and styles. We have heard loud and clear the connection many residents feel to the site, and want to explore how we can ensure villagers can access the facilities and celebrate the cultural and heritage connections, while ensuring we enhance and protect the things that make Waterbeach a special place to live.

The events will be held on:

- Thursday 29 September, 3-8pm
- Friday 30 September, 3-8pm
- Saturday 1 October, 10am-4pm

They will be in the Sports Hall and Studio, with further information and maps circulated in advance of the events, and transport laid on from the village to ensure everyone has the chance to come along. Further details will be posted through doors and available on the website in September.

Alongside the broader development, Urban&Civic have also been in discussion with the Parish Council about extending the current Village Cemetery, with the provision of an acre of land from the Barracks providing more space and the creation of new and refurbishment of existing footpaths to make them easier to use for wheelchairs and pushchairs. A planning application is being prepared to take this forward with the aspiration to submit

it during September.

I hope that you have managed to have had some sort of a break through the summer months? I must admit that it has been refreshing to have some time off but time now to get back to some sort of normality.

As you are probably aware there is much new build happening especially in the Cody Road/ Bannold Road area of the village. I do feel it for those living in the area. Especially

so for the new residents in the ex MOD houses in Haling Place with the disruption that they are having to endure. Sadly this is only the tip of the iceberg as Bovis Homes have started to build in the Bannold Road/Bannold Drove area. Persimmon Homes are going to yet another Inquiry. They have permission to build up to 90 dwellings in Bannold Road. Not satisfied they put in a new planning application for up it to 144 homes. South Cambridgeshire District Council refused it so hence off to the Inspector again. Will keep you posted.

Residents of Clare Close and Denny End Road are awaiting the outcome of a recent Inquiry regarding building 30 homes on Green Belt land between their houses and the Industrial Estate.

Urban & Civic continue to progress their planning application to build on the airfield outside the Local Plan and seemingly independent of RLW Estates who are the other developer in the Waterbeach New Town proposal in the Local Plan. Looks like Urban & Civic are initially proposing to build to the North of the fishing lake and runway according to their Environmental Scoping Document that has recently been out for consultation (South Cambs planning pages Waterbeach, Denny End Road ref S/1476/16/E2.) This throws up many issues regarding how sustainable this will be and how it will affect the village. Wouldn't it make more sense to build/develop the existing buildings closer to the village on brownfield land? Local services such as school, doctors, waste water management, drainage and increased traffic will all have to be managed with the utmost care whatever they do.

The Local Plan Inquiry is progressing slowly. The promised Waterbeach Hearing will probably be held in the New Year. Some residents have asked to speak at the Hearing. Follow the link to page 39. This give details of those invited to speak by the Inspector. So pleased residents have been included. https://www.scambs.gov.uk/sites/default/files/hearings_programme_v11_14 july 2016.pdf.

All of the above sounds like doom and gloom. Change will happen and it is trying to positively effect that change so that our village, community and businesses are protected. There is so much good stuff to celebrate that goes

on here. I think that it is worth the effort to try to get the best that we can for our families, friends and future residents. Look out for the Neighbourhood Plan Group Facebook page, logo and events that will be happening to enable us to have our say as to how our village is shaped and evolves in the future. This is where we live......

Fire and Rescue Service



Winter is coming and Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is encouraging all residents to get their chimney professionally swept before the cold sets in.

Top tips to enjoy an open fire safely:

- Sweep your chimney at least once a year and get brickwork inspected, especially the chimney breast and roof space.
- Do not bank fires too high or overload the grate, and remember to let them burn down well and check the hearth before going to bed.
- Use a fire or spark guard to prevent accidental fires.
- Do not place objects on or over the mantle-piece which may cause you to stand too close to the fire to reach or use them.
- Burn only suitable fuels and avoid burning resinous woods as soot builds up quickly.

Above all, ensure you have a working smoke alarm fitted on each floor or your home and a carbon monoxide alarm installed.
