Memorial benches - As you may be aware two longstanding members of Waterbeach Community

Association, Sid High and Dave Halsey, sadly passed away in recent years. Sid was an avid member of the community and worked tirelessly for the village for over 25 years. He was part of the Beach News team when the magazine was originally formed in the early 1970's and continued to assist with its production for many years thereafter. Sid was also part of the group that brought Waterbeach Feast back to life in 1971 after it had lapsed during the Second World War and he continued to organise the event for many years to follow.

Dave was always very active within Waterbeach since he moved here in 1975. When Dave became caretaker at the school he volunteered his expertise in printing to assist in the production of Beach News. He continued to set and print the magazine for over twenty years. As part of Waterbeach Community Association Dave was also very involved in the organisation of Waterbeach Feast too.

WCA would like to arrange suitable memorials to Sid and Dave to acknowledge all their hard work and a bench/seat for each on the Recreation Ground was felt to be a fitting memorial. As much of their time was spent organising the Feast on Waterbeach Green, a plaque to commemorate their work within the community will also be placed on one of the existing benches on the Green.

Library News

Waterbeach Library continues to thrive with new members joining every week raising our numbers higher than any other group in the community, or independent libraries in the



Cambridgeshire area. As is our aim we provide a service to Library members and the whole Community, being frequently congratulated on the friendly, helpful, professional service and environment we generate at every session. We perceive our members as friends, not members of a Library.

Our system of taking time to ascertain the types of books our clientele enjoy has resulted in considerable feedback to address the needs of our members. In particular we listen to the younger members of the Library who have moved to senior school as these are a difficult group to engage. However watching two 13 year old young men exiting the Library recently carrying eight books each to read, we think we may be achieving our objectives.

Our recent World Book Night was a success with many people popping in to choose their free book, plus enjoy wine and nibbles, even though the designated Saturday was not necessarily convenient for most.

At present we have our fifth Scout completing his Library Badge, we also provided facilities for Guides to complete their Reading Badge. During the past month we agreed to mentor a Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award candidate with his Voluntary Work aspect. This does seem to indicate Waterbeach Library provides a service which is valued by parents, and groups, within the wider community.

We are providing books to playgroups and nurseries in the area on a three week basis, with two being serviced on a collect and deliver system by our Volunteers. This is accomplished with no charge to the groups, nor to the Library, as no expenses are requested by our Volunteers. We understand other groups are considering joining this scheme.

Whilst we no longer have school classes visiting us we maintain contact with the school to provide resources and displays for the various projects the children undertake. This term it is the Animal Kingdom, plus we will be covering Shakespeare's 400th Anniversary this month. One of the younger members of the Library recently requested whether he could write a piece for the School Newsletter requesting Volunteers for the Library, both the Head Ms Green and Library were very willing for him to address this issue. He also requested to raise the matter at his School Council Meeting; again both the Library and School actively encouraged him in his efforts as both encourage children to think outside the box.

The Library commenced the Mums and Babies group on Wednesday 13th

April, 1.30-2.30pm, working in conjunction with the Dolphin Children's Centre, which proved a success. At present this will be held twice a term with a view to increase meetings in the future. The aim of these meetings is to engage parents in the process of reading to children from a very early age which has been proved to expand the vocabulary and reading abilities of children.

The Dolphin Centre, in co-operation with the Library, are holding their next Community meeting at the Library in June which brings together various community and statutory groups to discuss possible improvements in service to the individual. This is one more effort on the Volunteers part to work toward the Waterbeach Library providing some hub facilities, regardless of operating on voluntary staff.

The next large project we shall be addressing will be the Summer Reading Challenge 2016. It is hoped we may exceed the Reading Challenge numbers this year, but as last year was so successful this might be difficult, but we will do our utmost to excel.

Recently we have experienced a need to advertise for Volunteers due to some having to cease their sessions due to long term ill health, also responsibilities for elderly parents. We have no doubts we will be able to address the issue.

Waterbeach Library will continue to act in a frugal and responsible manner as regards the funds we hold as we are constantly aware we have a duty to provide best value and service, as per County Council requirements, for the taxpayers who support the Library.

Waterbeach Library is located in the Community Room on the Waterbeach School site. If you already have a Cambridgeshire Libraries card this can be used at Waterbeach, or you can join the Library there to enjoy the benefits of all Cambridgeshire Libraries. The Library is open on Monday 10 - 12noon and 3 - 5pm, Wednesday 6 - 8pm, Friday 2 - 5.30pm and Saturday 10 - 12noon.

Repair Café

Broken item? Don't throw it away - bring it to a Repair Café! Repair Cafés are meeting places where neighbours can repair their broken items, supported by experienced repairers, in a relaxed, sociable atmosphere with a cup of tea. The first Repair Café was held in Amsterdam in 2009. Cambridge and Cottenham have had several over the last couple of years, and now there will be more repair cafés in the villages around Cambridge.

The first of these will be held in the St Andrew's Centre, School Hill, Histon from 10:30 am to 1.30 pm on Saturday 18 June. The intention is to have subsequent repair cafés in other villages including Waterbeach. Volunteer engineers and fixers will be on hand to help fix small household appliances, gadgets, electronics, bicycles, clothes and general bits and bobs. Broken items can be booked in by emailing histmp@repaircafe.org.uk or calling 01223 301842 with a short description of the item and the fault. You can also turn up with an item on the day, up to 12.30p.m. but bookings are strongly encouraged so that sufficient repairers are on hand. The event is free. Donations are welcome to help cover costs.

News from Cllr. Peter Johnson

Pedestrian Crossing - Well at long last we have our pedestrian crossing and it is being used by people of all ages. This has been many years in the waiting and I thank all those people who did support this including Brian Williams and Maurice Leeke who came with me when we did the presentation at County Council Highways, not once, but twice. The first time we missed out by a point or two but second time lucky. Another plus point while the crossing was being installed we also managed to get the white lines at Station Road / St. Andrews Hill repainted. I have asked that the white lines be remarked at the Denny End / Bannold Road junction.

The Local Plan - This is due to start again in June but the section where Waterbeach is the subject is a long way off and I would not expect it to be before November. I do still have concerns about the amendments that South Cambs District Council have made where the limit to the number of houses has been removed and to start building as soon as possible. My concern is that the necessary infrastructure will not be in place, yet houses will be built with roads unable to cope, doctors' surgery overwhelmed, sewage problems, and the list goes on. Out of all the councillors present at that meeting I was the only one who voted against these amendments and will continue to do so because that is what I hear you all saying.

Station Car Park - There have been a few more issues with the car park. During January many of the lights were out but this has been traced to a power feed fault that has been rectified. Next we had reports of rats in the area so I contacted Network Rail who did a baiting session and it appears that the rat problem has also been resolved. Now the more tricky area of car parking and the old goods yard. I met with Gavin Wood on 22nd April and he is a Network Rail Manager so I had high hopes that at last a decision would be made. But Network Rail is not interested in running a car park, but he had no objections to someone leasing the land and using it as a car park. He is going to work out two prices for a lease, one will be to lease the land as it is and two for Network Rail to resurface the land and then lease it out. Of course option 2 will be more expensive but I expect to hear what these prices are within the next two weeks.

Street Lights - Cody Road suffered a real black period early in the year when the first five lampposts in from Bannold Road went out. Unfortunately this problem proved to be beyond the scope of Balfour Beatty and UK Power Networks had to get involved. The low voltage feed to lamppost No 5 was faulty and this in turn stopped the other 4 from working. Because it involved getting the Power Network to do the job they are allowed 28 days to repair faults as they work nationwide and not just local to our area. I am pleased to say they are all working now but other lights in the village are out. We also

had issues with lights on Greenside which were similar faults but are all working again now.

Primrose Lane - The Lane has new been resurfaced at the High Street end where it was in a poor state of repair, the new surface is wider than the original with tripping hazards all removed. Like so many projects they do take a long time to get going but once done they prove to be worth the wait.

Speed Limits - The speed limits on the approach roads to our village such as Denny End Road, Car Dyke Road, and Horningsea Road where the limit is at present 50mph, it is going to be reduced to 40mph as a measure to try and increase the safety on the roads to our village. This was another venture that had to be funded by the County Council Highways but Brian Williams and I again had to go and do a presentation to secure this funding, first time lucky this time.

Post Box - As you all know the post box was moved when the Post Office closed and was sited on the green which made it very difficult to get to. Other sites were looked at but one was disregarded because there were double yellow lines so the post man could not stop to empty it, the next location was disregarded because of underground services. I have now heard from Royal Mail that they have identified a site in the Waddelow Road / Denson Close area which they think is suitable, so fingers crossed we should soon get a post box back in that area again. The elderly in that area do need it as they are the generation that actually still send letters and cards and do not use emails as much as the younger generation.

Back at Playgroup we had a lovely reminder of Spring as a time of new beginnings with the arrival of our chick hatching program just before Easter. It was the first time that all of the ten eggs hatched successfully. At the end of the week, all of the chicks went to their new home with one of our families and the children have since had a chance to hear news and see photos of them growing up into hens and cockerels on the farm. We would like to say a big thank you to the Waterbeach Community Association for their donation which enabled us to run this program again this year.

Our books of the moment have had a spring-like feel too as we have enjoyed the Crunching Munching Caterpillar turn into a butterfly and helped Jasper the cat to grow a magic beanstalk in Jasper's Beanstalk.

Over the next few weeks we will be working closely with local primary schools to ensure that our pre-school children have a smooth transition to big-school in September. For those children who are going to Waterbeach, in addition to the very supportive program of activities offered by the school, we provide ideal opportunities to become familiar with the school site. As well as using the Forest School area, we take children to the school gym each week and to Waterbeach Library every third Monday.

We are open Monday to Friday in term time and offer a choice of sessions between 9am and 3pm. All our sessions are open to children from 2 until they start school. 15 hours County Council funding is available to all children from the term after their 3rd birthday and we also support the governments' Funded 2s program.

Spotted Flycatchers

Do you have this increasingly rare bird breeding in your garden?

Spotted Flycatchers are attractive little migrant birds which are summer visitors to UK village gardens and churchyards. Although they breed with us, they spend ten months of the year travelling between here and their wintering

in Southern grounds Africa This is increasingly dangerous journey for them, and sadly they are in deep Widespread decline. losses amounted to a 50% decline during 1995-2010, continuing an 88% decline since 1970.

Only some fifty pairs remain breeding in Cambridgeshire, so it's



now quite a rare bird, but most rural villages still have a pair or two. The Cambridge Bird Club is running a survey this year to find and monitor nesting pairs, and it's almost certain that there will be additional pairs in our villages of which they are not aware.

Where do you call home?

We are currently on a narrowboat heading for Wales as I write this. Narrowboats I think are like Marmite you either love them or hate them!!!

It is being away from home which made me think about the question where do we call home and what makes the place that we live home to us?

For me it is all encompassing, family, friends, good work life balance, access to schools, doctors and shops. A community around me that has many volunteers enabling all ages to come together. There is easy access (although mightily congested at times) to transport links or to step out into the countryside to recharge the batteries or find peace and tranquillity in the gentle Fens and surrounding countryside.

This is what Waterbeach means to me and why I continue to work towards keeping our identity and build on our community.

I appreciate that this is going to be different for each of us depending upon individual circumstances.

I know that I have to be realistic and realise that everything must change. It is having a voice to manage the change and evolve I think that counts.

I know that things are by no way perfect here and there is much to do but I think that the effort is worth it. One of my main objectives is with the help of others to get information out so that we can make our own minds up about how our villages in the Parish are shaped now and for the future.

We have the challenges and opportunities of a New Town on our doorstep. We wrestle with congestion on the trains and the roads. We need to ensure that essential public services have enough capacity now to cope with existing requirements and future development, especially the 300 homes to be delivered in the Bannold Road area and the proposed Waterbeach New Town.

There has been much work going on in the background regarding the Bannolds to raise various issues at the planning consultation stage.

There is still the Local Plan Inquiry to work towards for the Waterbeach Hearing which may take place later this year.

Urban & Civic still intend to go early to submit a pre planning application for their first tranche of housing to South Cambridgeshire District Council in the Autumn. This will probably be outside the Local Plan Inquiry of which Waterbeach New Town is included if the timelines don't run together.

The Neighbourhood Plan is still in the embryonic stage but I feel that we are now on our way with it. The working party consists of members of the community and Parish Councillors in partnership to bring this forward. There

London to Paris Cycle Ride

My name is Sammy Cradock. My family moved to Waterbeach in 2002 so many of you know me and my parents who both work in the village.



In December 2014 I was knocked off my push bike by a truck. I was taken to Addenbrooke's Hospital and after a day in A&E being assessed and having scans, I was taken to ward A5 where I spent four days flat on my back with a neck brace on. I had torn ligaments in my neck and was lucky that there was no lasting or serious damage. I continued to wear the collar for another couple of months until the ligaments had healed.

The care I received on the ward was phenomenal and even the other patients in my bay helped me. I strongly felt that I wanted to give something back and decided to do some fundraising for ACT (Addenbrooke's Charitable Trust).

My friend Chris is doing a charity bike ride from London to Paris (approx. 300 miles) over four days in September. We are both also participating in two 24 hour long marathons of playing pool. All money raised will go towards treatment for people with spinal cord injuries and research to progress knowledge.

Urban&Civic

It has been a busy but rewarding few months for the Urban&Civic team as we have been continuing to work with the local community and partners to develop the right plans for the former barracks and airfield and to start to open it back up to local people.

Following on from the Open Days, held in October 2015 - which offered the chance for people to meet the team, tour the site, and feedback on key aspirations, issues and concerns — the team developed a series of workshops to go into the issues raised in more detail.

The workshops - The workshops aimed to help us develop a shared approach – a Development Framework - for the land north of the village, and south of Denny Abbey, from the A10 in the west over to the railway line in the east. We did this working with neighbouring landowners, represented by RLW Estates, to provide a coherent and joined up approach for people to engage with more fully.

The 5 workshops, with local partners, statutory agencies, and the local community covered:

- · vision and principles
- green infrastructure such as landscape and habitats: for nature and people
- heritage looking at the history of the site and important heritage around the local area
- transport and utilities, such as power, water, digital connections
- community facilities, including health, education, sports and other amenities

The workshops were held January to March and a write-up of each of the community sessions are available on our website.

A further drop-in session was held on 21 and 23 April to feedback and test the key messages that emerged from those workshops and allow more people to drop in at their convenience to discuss their views with the team and inform the evolving designs.

Emerging key principles - From these discussions some core principles have emerged which will be set out in more detail in the Development Framework Document, which will be published in May. These are:

1) The Next Chapter

- Embedding the strengths of existing assets;
- Ensuring the existing community and village retain their distinctive identity and character;
- A new lease of life for the barracks;
- Links to Denny Abbey and Wicken Fen re-established.

2) Inherited Richness

- Embedding water bodies and channels, mature trees and species-rich grassland;
- The Roman Car Dyke and Denny Abbey preserved and enhanced;
- Features of the airfield and barracks will underlie the new pattern of development.

3) A vibrant, mixed community

- Homes to support a variety of lifestyles for local people and newcomers;
- · Facilities to support active and healthy lifestyles;
- Long-term and active engagement and support for the new community.

4) Well Connected

- Capacity improvements to the A10 and new pedestrian and cycle provision;
- Potential for a new guided bus, a relocated railway station and a park and ride facility;
- High quality infrastructure and multiple interlinked public transport options.

5) Thriving Economy

- Part of the constellation of towns in the Greater Cambridge region;
- Not a dormitory but a vibrant destination;
- New employment uses on site to support the indigenous growth of small businesses.

6) Exceptional Design

- Well-designed, contemporary new homes;
- Innovative, attractive community buildings;
- Exceptional, sustainably designed public realm.

7) Stewardship

- Commitment to put in place effective governance and long-term maintenance;
- Working together with local partners, groups and organisations;
- Effective management of construction to minimise negative impacts and maximise job, skill and local supply chain opportunities.

Urban&Civic are now developing a planning application for the Barracks and Airfield site, based on these principles, and will be holding a further round of events to share and develop these in June/July. All of the displays listed above are available on the Waterbeach Barracks website, along with the Open Day Summary Report and notes of the Community workshops. As well as regular events, groups and classes use the Sports Hall, Studio area, community building and squash courts, including yoga, football, Fitness4living, Waterbeach Badminton, Waterbeach Brass Band, Cambridge Triathlon Club, and the Army Cadets.


The event will run on the weekends of July 2/3, 9/10, 16/17 and 23/24. Not all artists will be exhibiting every weekend so it is important to check the website,

Visitors are encouraged to visit as many studios as possible, perhaps planning a route through a particular area incorporating lunch or tea in one of the many local eateries. The participating studios are spread throughout the whole region,

not just in the city centre, and there will be a wonderful variety of talent on show, with some artists collaborating to share their exhibition space on their chosen dates. As usual, the distinctive yellow COS flags will be out to identify participating studios.

The former barracks and airfield at Waterbeach, offer a range of community facilities for local groups including;




At Little Stars Day Nursery we care for children from 3 months until 5 years and accept funding for 2, 3 and 4 year olds, either full time or term time only.
