Youth and Community Building

The Parish Council has submitted plans for a Youth and Community Building on the Recreation Ground near the Sports Pavilion. This project has been considered for a long time and there have been a number of false starts, but we hope that we are finally going to be able to have a building in the village which will provide space for more community activities and a new home for the Youth Club. The proposed building will have an area for Youth Club which can be partitioned off when not in use and a community area which will include meeting space, kitchen and toilets.

Plans have also been submitted for a new Groundsman's shed near the proposed new building. This will enable the Parish Council to have improved storage facilities for equipment and materials on the Recreation Ground.

Precept

At the February meeting of the Parish Council the precept for 2008-9 was set. This is the amount of money which is paid by council tax payers to the Parish Council. It was agreed that the precept should increase by 4.7%. This amounts to an increase of about £2.40 a year (or less than 1p a day) for a band D property.

NEW BUS PASS SCHEME

The Government's 2006 Budget statement announced a new national Concessionary Bus Travel scheme would be introduced in April 2008. The scheme will allow eligible residents (over 60s and people with certain disabilities) to use their bus pass after 9.30am until the last bus, Monday to Friday and all day on weekends and bank holidays, in any part of England for the first time.

WAY - Youth Club

THE 'WAY' TO INVOLVE TEENAGERS

The WAY project was set up in July 2002 to collect together available youth funding, ranging from government and local council funds, major funding bodies and personal pledges. The charity then uses those funds to pay a Community Youth Outreach Worker (Dave Beasley) for 26 hours each week, running both the youth club evenings and a support and advice dropin centre 2 afternoons a week, based out of the youth club building on Waterbeach Recreation Ground. Dave also works within the local community offering support at home for a number of families.

Individual supporters have been amazingly generous financially and the project, now in its successful 6th year has helped support many young people, both in difficult personal situations and those out of work into jobs. Our community police officer, Constable Phil Shulver, reports that youth crime has significantly decreased compared with similar villages in the area.

Many young people enjoy the benefits of what is on offer at Youth Club, we currently have 268 registered members, aged 11-19 years and frequently see over 50 young people at each session. Over the last 3 months we have

been able to offer a variety of activities including free Karate classes for teenage girls, a free trip to Go-Ape in Thetford Forest, visits from Shepreth Wildlife Park and the Reptile Experience, free fruit kebabs, many craft activities, sport activities, pool knockouts, air hockey, free use of wireless laptops and generally a place to socialise with friends in a safe environment.

Youth Club is open on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday evenings, from 7pm and we offer afternoon drop-ins on Mondays and Wednesdays for personal advice and support. So, if you are aged 11-19 and have not yet encountered the delights of what we have to offer, please call in and see what's going on, we would be delighted to welcome you.

We have just received some funding from the vProject to implement a 'Village Volunteers' project. This involves young people putting together a programme of volunteering opportunities for 16-25 year olds to work at short taster sessions of volunteering within their community. If you would like to be involved in the project, either as a volunteer, or as a recipient of some volunteer time, please contact me.

If you are interested in finding out more about the WAY Project, or if you would like to offer some financial support to the work we are doing with young people, please do contact me, I can provide regular updates on specific projects and special appeals.

Waterbeach Eco-town

WHAT DO YOU THINK?

Many of you will have seen in the local paper headlines relating to proposals to build one of the government's new eco-towns on the Waterbeach Barracks site.

To those of us with longish memories, these plans are just a rehash of the proposals put forward about five years ago when the County Council was determining its structure plan and deciding upon the location of a new settlement. The result of that process was that Northstowe was agreed as the site, and this was confirmed by a government inspector at an Examination in Public. However, there has been quite a bit of publicity recently about these plans, and about other eco-towns or eco-villages proposed in the area so I thought it might be useful to try to give some idea of what is going on.

If you want to see details of the actual proposals or the government's prospectus, then you will find links on www.waterbeach.org.uk/pcnews. This article is a very brief summary of what I know and may be coloured by my very considerable reservations about this scheme. Can I emphasise that the views I express are my views and have not been approved explicitly by any of the local Councils.

What are eco-towns?

The government says that

"Eco-towns will be small new towns of at least 5-20,000 homes. They are intended to exploit the potential to create a complete new settlement to achieve zero carbon development and more sustainable living using the best new design and architecture."

They go on to say that

"Government is looking to encourage and support local authorities and the private sector to bring forward around five new schemes."

There are good ideas here and we should all welcome sustainable communities. However, the main thing that worries many of your locally elected representatives including your Parish Council, your District and County Councillors and your local MP is that decisions on eco-towns may be made independently of the local planning process. As one Warwickshire County Councillor said when referring to a local development "I believe planning 6,000-plus houses on a piece of paper does not build community cohesion in an instant like that."

What about the Waterbeach proposal?

The idea is to use the barracks site plus other land between the barracks and the railway to build a new town of 10,000 homes. Waterbeach currently has around 2,000 homes so you will see just how huge this development would be. The town would include up to 4,000 jobs and would have its own schools and shops. The proponents say that they would turn the A10 into a dual carriageway and that they would build a new station to serve the town. They also say that it will link with the guided bus although it is difficult to see how that works.

There is not space here to go through the proposals in detail and discuss why some of us believe they simply will not work. However, here are just a few points, some of which we made five years ago when Ray Gambell from Landbeach and I appeared before the Examination in Public of the Structure plan.

- With 10,000 houses and just 4,000 jobs, how will all those who don't live within the settlement get to work?
- There are sections of the A10 that simply cannot be dualled because of development on either side. What about the section from Denny End to the Slap Up?
- The Army are expanding at Waterbeach and would only move if money were found to finance a new location
- The area is low-lying and, although not in an obvious flood risk area, would become much more susceptible if covered with housing at the high densities proposed
- Although roughly half the site is MoD land and airfield, over one third is good quality agricultural land
- Although the railway will provide good transport links, the availability of fast and frequent services to London is bound to encourage those who work there rather than helping to alleviate the pressure on Cambridgeshire's housing.

The Parish, District and County Councils are all opposed to this development as is our local MP. But what do you think? We opposed the original proposals something over five years ago but attitudes may have changed. Please let us know. WASPS ARE CELEBRATING!

Waterbeach After School Playscheme (WASPS) first opened in September 1997. This academic year 2007/2008 we are celebrating our 10th Birthday! We are also celebrating as we had our Ofsted inspection in September; the result of the inspection was 'Good' which really means WASPS is a very good provision!

WASPS aims to provide an atmosphere similar to home. During their time at the club the children are able to direct their own time and play using our resources, they choose the activities that suit them best. Whether it is joining in with the planned activities such as arts and crafts, relaxing by the television or chatting with friends, reading, doing their homework, drawing, playing board games, playing football or other outdoor activities - all under the guidance of our experienced and qualified team of Play Workers. The children are provided with snacks and refreshments throughout the session – there is always plenty to talk about at toast time!

For the first few years of WASPS we were based in a spare classroom at Waterbeach Community Primary School and then later in the school hall. As the numbers of children attending grew and grew our small club expanded and we employed more staff and added a Holiday Club (now running through the majority of the school holidays) and Breakfast Club (running each morning before school) to our services. In 2001 we moved into our new purpose built building 'Waterbeach Playhouse' on the school site, which we share with Waterbeach Community Playgroup, this was funded through the National Lottery.

As part of our celebrations we are planning a birthday party in April, we will be inviting children and their families past and present and other people who have been involved with WASPS over the years. We are hoping to send invites out very soon...if you have been involved with WASPS and don't receive an invite, please don't be offended, get in touch with us! It's difficult tracking everyone down. We felt that a party would be a nice way to thank everyone involved in WASPS, present and past, in making it the successful club that it is.

We have a small sub-committee working on preparations for the party, consisting of staff and committee members and some past WASPS children (now young adults!), we are very grateful for their support. Neighbourhood Watch

DISTRACTION BURGLARIES

We are fortunate that the level of crime in our villages is relatively low. However that does not mean that crime does not happen or that we should stop being vigilant. Across the district there have been a number of instances of bogus callers and distraction burglaries, where someone has called at the front door possibly posing as an official from the police or a utility company, whilst someone else has gone in through the back door. High visibility patrols are being used to reassure residents. However by taking a few precautionary measures, the risk of becoming a victim can be reduced.

- Ensure your front and back doors are locked (to prevent anyone just walking into your home)
- Ensure all windows; especially those on the ground floor are fitted with locks.
- Take care with open windows. Did you know that an intruder can gain entry through an opening no larger than 9" (22cm)?

When answering the door to a caller remember the following:-

- Lock! Before opening the front door, ensure the back door is locked.
- Think! Are you expecting anyone? Do you normally get callers at this time?
- Stop! Always put the door chain or door bar across before you open the door. (This presents a physical and psychological barrier which shows the caller that you are in charge)
- Check: Never assume that what the caller is saying is true. Always ask for their I.D., take your time to check it and feel free to close the door whilst the checks are being made. Be aware that a bogus caller will have bogus I.D. so don't always believe what is on the card e.g. telephone numbers, especially mobile numbers. Always use the phone directory to authenticate identification. Remember a genuine caller will not mind waiting or will call back at a more convenient time.

If you are still not sure, don't open the door.

If you have any information about suspicious callers/vehicles in your area please call the Police on **0845 456 456 4 quoting Operation Promenade**. If you feel you are the victim of a crime and the suspect is still in the vicinity or you are witnessing a crime **dial 999 immediately.**

Satellite Navigation Systems

Don't leave your Sat Nav on the dash board. If you can't take it with when you leave the car hide it in the boot and make sure the connecting lead and holder are also hidden. Make sure there are no suction marks on the dashboard. Leaving the glove compartment open to show that you have not hidden one away there may help deter thieves breaking in on the off chance of finding something valuable.

Dog fouling

Remember that allowing your dog to make a mess on the pavement is an offence and can result in a large fine if it is reported, as well as being very unpleasant and a potentially serious health hazard for other pedestrians. **Always clean up after your dog**. And thank you to the many responsible dog walkers who already do this.

District County News

A MESSAGE FROM COUNCILLOR JAMES HOCKNEY

Since 2004 it has been a real privilege to be your local District Councillor. Many of you have contacted me with problems and issues to address, and I will always do my level best to help.

Since the last Beach News there have been a number of new developments on issues to report as detailed below.

Waterbeach Road Safety

The Highways Department have agreed to put a 20mph speed limit on the High Street and two flashing Interactive Speed Signs on Denny End Road. It is expected for this work to be at the very least substantially completed by the end of March.

Cllr Johnson and myself will now turn our attention to campaigning for improvements entering Waterbeach along Car Dyke Road/Cambridge Road. If you have any thoughts or ideas on this then please let us know.

The issue of a pedestrian crossing near the Pharmacy/Village Stores remains and this will also be an issue which we will not rest until it is resolved.

'Eco Town' Housing Threat

As some of you might have already heard, we are under the renewed threat of a new town being built on Waterbeach Barracks.

In 2004 we faced the threat when the Buchanan Report earmarked Waterbeach for a potential development of 5,000 houses. The petition campaign that was organised sent a clear message that we did not want a new town, people power certainly won the day with the large numbers of residents who got behind the campaign and signed the petition.

This new proposal would be for 10,000 to create a so-called 'eco-town'. This has come about as last year the Government asked developers for 'Ecotown' proposals of at least 5,000 to 20,000 houses.

So far there have been sixty 'Eco-town' applications put forward, these will be whittled down to ten schemes, which could be announced by the time you read this article.

Just as before I will stand with local residents to ensure that Waterbeach remains the wonderful rural village this it is.

Bus Service

Many of you have contacted me to raise your concerns about the cut backs and changes to the local bus service for Landbeach and Waterbeach. I am pleased to report that I have launched the 'Better bus service' petition campaign to press Stagecoach for an improved service.

Thank you to all the hundreds of residents that have already signed the petition so far.

Cllr Peter Johnson has put forward a proposal to increase the bus service by re-adjusting the timetable, this I fully support.

Immobilise

PROTECT YOUR BELONGINGS

Immobilise is a free way to identify property and catch thieves. This website is searched thousands of times every day by police officers resulting in thieves being removed from the streets and property returned to its rightful owner.

It is very simple to register items on www.immobilise.com. A user I.D. and password is generated allowing YOU to access your site and add or delete items at any time. There is no limit to the number of items you can register. Registered items are instantly identifiable making it far more likely that your property will be returned, the thief found and a successful prosecution achieved.

Any item with a serial number, like Sat Navs, Laptops and ipods can be registered FREE of charge. For items like jewellery, antiques or horses there is the facility to upload photographs.

Imagine the scenario that your house has been burgled and your computer, which contains the inventory of your belongings, has been stolen. If you had registered with immobilise you could go to any computer, log on with your own I.D. and password and print out an inventory for the insurance company and the police.

If you had a mobile phone stolen it is possible to register in retrospect on Immobilise simply by contacting your airtime provider and asking for the IMEI number. The reason for doing this is as follows:

Having registered the IMEI number of the phone it is possible to go straight into the account and register the phone as lost/stolen. This means that, if the phone turns up in the hands of the police anywhere in the country, when they run a check on the IMEI number it will not only show that you are the registered owner but also the crime details. This will give police a fighting chance of finding out who committed the theft. It can give good evidence to support a successful prosecution and once blocked the handset will be 'Immobilised ' and even replacing the Sim Card will not make the handset work again.


The Bower
