Collections — A few years ago the Community BRINGING THE COMMUNITY TOGETHER Association decided that we would like to support local clubs, groups, charities and other worthy causes. It was felt that the amount collected would be of substantial use to those closer to home.

The chosen charity for 2009 was Waterbeach After School Play Scheme (WASPS) to fund improvements to their IT equipment. As you know we had considered extending the Feast into a weeklong event and asked for ideas and support. However, very little interest was shown and therefore we cannot continue and Feast will be a one day event as usual on 12th June.

WASPS



Thank you from WASPS (Waterbeach After School Play Scheme).

Children, staff and committee members were thrilled to be nominated as the Community Association charity for last year, and, were enormously grateful for the cheque we received in January.

Waterbeach After School Play Scheme (WASPS) shares the building with Waterbeach Community Playgroup within the school grounds. Although in the school grounds we are a separate entity. We have a small, but dedicated team of 7 staff. We are a registered charity and are Ofsted inspected (a copy of our most recent report is on our website).

WASPS provides child care, for children aged 4 - 11. In the twelve years we have been open we have gradually increased our provision, starting with the after school club, then the breakfast club and finally a holiday club during the school holidays. We have a dedicated and experienced staff team whose primary concern is the welfare of the children in their care. Their philosophy is one of play being child lead. Our joint co-ordinators are responsible for the day to day running of the clubs with overall responsibility taken by the management committee.

Last year, we approached the Community Association to ask whether we would be considered for their charity of the year. Our reason for this request was that we were keen to improve our IT provision for both running the club and for the children. We wanted to set up a website, to get a phone connection into The Playhouse and to put our fees and booking facilities on line to provide easy access for our parents. Fortunately for us one of our committee members had experience of this and therefore gave a lot of her time voluntarily with assistance from our co-ordinators to complete the project. We are now at the stage where we have asked the children how they would like the remainder of the money to be used.

We are very proud of our website and our achievements relating to this over the last year. If you have time, and you have access to a computer, please have a look at our website at www.waterbeach-wasps.org.uk, it's the ideal way to find out more about what we do.

As we have a small staff team we do have to plan for any absences, therefore, we are always looking for people to join us as a Bank Playworker, i.e. to be called upon as and when needed. News From Cllr. Peter Johnson

Work has now started on the new Youth Club/Community Building, it is a little later than anticipated but we needed to have a project manager to ensure all went to plan. It is hoped that completion will be late October and I am sure that we all look forward to having this new building in use for all the village to enjoy. It is hoped that new groups that previously had nowhere to meet will form and use the facilities that the new building will offer.

The Public Art Committee that was formed following a public meeting in February has now moved on to form the Waterbeach Cultural Collective (WCC). The WCC is a constituted voluntary group and includes individuals with skills in arts management, education and arts practice and is chaired by the director of a visual arts centre. I am sure that will this will make the best use of the S106 Public Art contribution to the benefit of all of the village.

This year we will see a change in the view of the High Street as a result of a planning application, No.19 High Street will be demolished to make way for 4 small houses and a bungalow at the rear of the land. It is times like this I hope that someone takes photos of our village to record the changes that keep happening.

There has been lots of talk about local recycling sites such as the Butt Lane site being closed in the near future due to the new recycling plant at Donarbon coming into operation. This is not the case and the Butt Lane site will be open for the foreseeable future.

Crafts At Denny

Monday 3rd May 2010

Last year, while chatting to visitors at Denny Abbey and the Farmland Museum – just minutes up the road towards Chittering – I was amazed at the number of people, especially from Waterbeach itself, who said it was the first



time they had visited this attractive site. Visitors were impressed by the range of displays and artefacts, the atmospheric ambience of the Abbey and the workshops and buildings that featured large in the lives of generations of country folk. Those visitors 'of a certain age' were overheard saying delightedly 'My mother had one of those....' when they recognised familiar household objects from the 1920s and 1930s in Walnut Tree Cottage; some treated themselves to a quarter of pear drops or a sherbet fountain when they visited the shop – treats which reminded them of the carefree days of their childhood, even if inflation had reached even there and they had to fork out 5p for a liquorice stick!

What has all this got to do with the title of this piece? An attempt to lure you to visit your local historic site ... true ... but also to inform you that in May, you can visit the Farmland Museum and enjoy all its attractions with the added bonus of enjoying crafts old and new. (Normal admission prices apply). The Friends of the Farmland Museum are organising a day of demonstrations and displays of traditional crafts such as spinning, weaving, knitting, rag rug making and patchwork, as well as a Craft Fair at which a range of local crafts people will be displaying and selling their hand crafted items – everything from artwork, candles and cards to woodwork, preserves, handmade toys.... and many more besides. There will be opportunities to purchase unique gifts and to 'have-a-go' at some traditional crafts, together with specially designed activities for children – a real family day out.

Busy Bees at Waterbeach School

Last year, our school organised a highly successful environment week which introduced the children to reasons why we need to care for our world both locally and globally. Children, staff and parents all felt this was an important part of life in the school and we have continued to work on lessening our impact on the environment and to build links with a school in Malawi.

In May we are organising another 'environment' week this time with the focus on bees. Around the world bees are dying. In the UK about one fifth of hives were lost in 2008/09. Around the world bee populations are in decline. This is serious as globally bees are responsible for pollinating a third of all the food we eat! Reasons for this decline are unclear, it could be weather, nutrition or pesticide poison.

Whatever the reason, Waterbeach Community Primary School has decided to take action! Our Bee Week is going to be BIG and we need your help. Throughout the week we will be constructing 'bee hotels', planting bee friendly flowers and fruit trees and looking at the different uses of honey. We will be working with our link school in Malawi to find out what environment bees need in both countries and how honey is collected and used. As a reminder to look after our world we would like a sculpture that shows how we care for even the smallest creatures on the planet.

To make this week a great success we need help. Do you have a skill or interest related to bees that would enlighten the children? Are you an artist or sculptor? We would like children to work with you to design a sculpture for our school and another one to send to Malawi. Can you plant trees? We shall be organising a community tree planting day for volunteers to come and help us.

Already on board are local bee keepers, the National Trust and our PTA but any other ideas or suggestions for bee activities would be much appreciated. Please keep an eye on our website which will be posting dates, times and activities as they become available.

Did You Know....?



Some older residents might remember that the Victorian post-box in Station Road was originally on the opposite side of the road to its present location. It was built into a brick pillar at the entrance of the old Burial Ground.

In the 1950's the pillar was demolished by a vehicle. The post-box was then taken to the Post Office in High Street where it laid in the backyard thereof for a while.

At about this time Mr Frank Billett, the owner of Station Road Bakery (demolished in 1986 and replaced with two houses), was replacing a large, black, wooden, slate-roofed barn with a brick built garage for his delivery vans. He contacted Mr Frank Pye, the Sub-Postmaster at the time, suggesting that the post-box be built into the wall of the garage. The Postal Authorities agreed. Consequently, the post-box has remained in this location to this day.

Art In Waterbeach

On 15th February 2009 a public meeting was held in Waterbeach School to announce that, in line with South Cambs District Council policy, Morris Homes, builders of the Bannold Road development, had contributed £50,000 towards public arts provision for the village.

Over the next few months further meetings took place, chaired by Andy O'Hanlon, District Council Arts Officer, representatives of Waterbeach Parish Council and a group of interested villagers. It was decided to solicit ideas at the 2009 Waterbeach Feast for using the provision, and a number of useful and interesting contributions were received that demonstrated people in the village wanted active participation in arts activities.

As a result, over the following months, an organisation, the Waterbeach Cultural Collective [WCC], was formally constituted to work with the other stakeholders: the Parish Council, the District Council and Morris Homes on the direction of the provision. An interim committee was appointed comprising: Donna Lynas, Chair; Pam Pfrommer, Treasurer; Kate D'Arcy, Secretary; and Chris Evans.

A brief was drafted for the selection of an artist with a view to possible physical interventions [artworks] in Waterbeach, but also to conduct a skills audit and to lead, enable and encourage contributions to the cultural life of the village, in various disciplines and through various forums, by the villagers themselves.

We are now holding a second public meeting in Waterbeach School on 17th March at 7.00pm to encourage people living in Waterbeach and the surrounding villages to join the WCC: it is a great way to meet new people and a unique opportunity to generate creative activity in the village. One of the first jobs to do will be to help judge artists' submissions in response to the brief, which we will talk through with you at the meeting. We also want to choose a date for an Annual General Meeting, so that we can formally widen our membership and re-elect Committee membership. Please come and support us and be part of steering arts activity in Waterbeach into the future.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank our friends and family for all their kind wishes and support following Lee's recent 'football blunder' at Waterbeach Rec. on Saturday 30^{th} January. Everybody's kindness has been overwhelming and it is nice to know that people care.

Road Resurfacing

With the recent bad weather, more roads and paths need attention in Landbeach, Waterbeach and Chittering. If you have any areas that need particular urgent attention please let me know and I will do my level best to get action for the Highways Department.

On better news it was great to see that Burgess Road and Waddelow Road have been completely resurfaced for the first time in decades. This has followed years of campaigning through the Better Roads, Safer Roads campaign.

Waterbeach Pedestrian Crossing

The campaign to make crossing by the Pharmacy/Village Stores safer continues. As a result of the Pedestrian Road Safety petition campaign ran by myself and Cllr Peter Johnson, Highways finally agreed to work up a proposed scheme.
