

Updates From South Cambs

SEASONAL GREETINGS FROM COUNCILLOR JOHNSON

I wish all the residents of Waterbeach, Landbeach, and Chittering a Very Happy Christmas and I hope the New Year is good for you all.

This has been a busy year behind the scenes and for all the people who have contacted me, I hope I have resolved the issues to your satisfaction. I never see your problems as an issue, but a challenge to get the answers you want to hear, sometimes it may take longer than we like, but I like to think we do get there in the end.

We saw the introduction of a new bus service, the No 8 which started at the end of May and this was on a "Use it or Lose it" trial as it was to be run on a profit making basis. Unfortunately not enough people did use the service and it is very likely that this service will cease very soon, but I will continue to work to get a bus service that is run at times more suitable for the residents of our villages.

Our traffic calming measures in Waterbeach have taken longer than expected to be completed, I understand that there have been technical issues, but these should have been sorted out by the time you are reading this. The 20 mph limit along he High Street in front of the school will help to reduce the possibility of the village children getting injured and the 30 mph flashing signs will help to remind drivers to slow down. I have had many comments about the one opposite the Brewery Tap, this is to remind drivers to keep to the limit because we have had a few cars going too fast round the corner and losing control and finishing upside down in a lady's garden.

Next year we can look forward to seeing a new Youth Club/Community building being built adjacent to the New Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. This has come about after attending the AGM of the Way Project and seeing how the Youth Workers and the children had a very limited and cramped space to work in and realising that something had to be done about it. A number of people have been involved in getting this project from an idea to becoming a reality and many hours have been spent with the architect and planners. Numerous meetings have taken place, but we have now received planning permission so next year all the efforts of myself, Parish Council, Kevin King our architect, and all the people who wrote letters of support for this project, we will see the fruit of our labours.

The History of Road Names

CAR DYKE ROAD

The short stretch of fairly new road connecting Cambridge Road to the Slap Up junction with the A10 takes its name from a most extensive waterway system stretching from the River Cam near Clayhithe to the River Trent in Lincolnshire. It seems certain that this was constructed by the Romans in the second century AD, and served both as a canal and as a catchwater drain.

From Waterbeach it crossed the A10 at Goose Hall and then passed north of Cottenham to Lockspit Hall where it joined the Old West River which then flowed the other way to Earith. There it linked with the now extinct West Water and then to Cnut's Dyke. Skirting Peterborough, it used part of the River Nene and than a channel cut to the River Welland. From there it ran to Thurlby and thence through Bourne along the edge of the Lincolnshire fens. This part of its course can be easily traced up to the point where it joined the River Witham just east of Lincoln. That river was then used to link the route to another Roman canal the Fossdyke, which leads to the River Trent at Torksey. This must have provided a most useful route for the transport of grain and materials to the Romans forces in the north, as well as providing a drainage channel, of which parts are still being used for that purpose in Lincolnshire and are called Car Dyke.

Park and Ride

As I am sure most of you know, the new Park and Ride is open at Butt Lane, Milton. I haven't used it yet, but I have driven through it and I am a bit concerned that some of the signposting is not as clear as it might be. I would welcome comments so that they can be passed on to the powers that be.

Mereham and Waterbeach (again!)

Just as we all thought these ideas for new development had gone away, they reappear in a different guise. Both have appeared on a list produced by the East of England Regional Assembly as sites for new developments in the period to 2031. It is very important to note that these are proposals from developers and have not been approved and I am frankly surprised that Mereham, a site that has recently been so resoundingly rejected by a Planning Inspector after a lengthy public enquiry, should have got anywhere near the list.

However, proposals for Waterbeach (or Denny St. Francis as the developers insist on calling it) with 12,750 dwellings, have not yet been subjected to such a thorough review, and so those of us who are unhappy with the idea of so many houses being built on the barracks site still need to be extremely vigilant. I'll keep you all in touch with what is going on.

Station Parking

The very high usage that our station gets means that we get an excellent rail service both north and south. However, many of you, especially those who live in Lode Avenue, have to put up with inconsiderate parking by some commuters. A couple of months ago, I called a meeting between the County Council, Network Rail and First Capital Connect where these issues were discussed, and it seems that there is a real possibility that the station car park may be doubled in size in the not too distant future. I'll keep up the pressure and hope to be able to report good news soon.


NATIVITY SCENE EXHIBITION

EXCITING NEW TERM

The new term has seen us welcome a new

part-time play worker to the team; Nikko Thomas joins our friendly team which is led by Wayne Badcock, assisted by Lesley Moxon and Tricia Palmer; the team between them have clocked up 37 years of service at Waterbeach Toddler Playgroup. Before half term we looked at Diwali, the Hindu 'Festival of Lights'. We made some clay Diva's and decorated them. We also looked at 'Megs Veg', painting pictures of Megs Veg, (carrots, peas and a pumpkin) and making stripy Mogs.

Now half term is over and we're starting to prepare for Christmas. The children are beginning to learn their Christmas songs, and the sultry sounds of 'Jingle Bells' and 'Away in a manger' are being heard everywhere! We will hopefully be going on our normal tour of the village, singing our songs at Denson Close and Hatley Court, as well as for the parents/carers. So get the glitter and tinsel at the ready, and let the fun begin!

We have kicked off the year with lots of good news which we would like to share:

The first is that we will soon be receiving a high tech ICT resource in the form of an Interactive White Board. Jagex Ltd, a Cambridge online games company, have kindly donated just over £3,000 for us to purchase the white board. We are extremely grateful for this donation, and we will be the only playgroup in the village to have one. We've seen them in use at the Early Years Centre in Histon; they are great fun, and it will also help the children to get used to using one prior to starting school. We are hoping that the installation will be taking place before the New Year, and the staff will be receiving training on this before we let the children loose on it!

The second piece of exciting information comes in the form of a nomination to the Cambridge Evening News 'Community Awards 2008'. One of our current parents has nominated the playgroup in the 'Children's Support' category. They felt they wanted the staff to be recognised for the work that we do at the playgroup. Since the nomination we have reached the final of the awards, and have been invited to the awards ceremony on 8th December. As you can imagine we are extremely excited about this. Both Wayne and Lesley will be attending the awards. Keep your fingers crossed,

and we will inform you of the outcome.

Thirdly, the Community Association has generously voted to raise money for the playgroup by way of a bucket collection at the Christmas Eve Carols on the Green, so please do come along to enjoy the event and show your support, and a few pennies in the buckets wouldn't go amiss either!

This year the Committee will be working hard to raise funds to "smarten up" the external appearance of our building, with a new coat of paint, a new sign and new doors all on our wish list. Fingers crossed if we are able to raise enough funds we will get some new windows too, and make some more improvements to the outside play area. WTP-led events throughout the year are fast becoming welcome fixtures in the village calendar. The Auction of Promises at the White Horse in January and the Mother's Day Cake & Flowers Stall outside the Post Office in March to name but a few. For the first time this year in August we held a Family Fun Day at the White Horse (jointly organised with the Community Playgroup) which was a great success (despite the torrential rain for the first part of the afternoon!), and by 5 o'clock the Bouncy Castle was up, the sun was shining and everyone was having a great time. The Nearly New Sale held in November was our most popular yet for both sellers and buyers, raising £600 for the playgroup, and offering bargains galore for shoppers! In fact it was such a success we now hope to hold it twice a year, so watch this space. Details of upcoming events can be found in the "What's On" on the Community Association website; and also look out for posters and signs around the village closer to the dates throughout the year.

Waterbeach Toddler Playgroup has been running for over 30 years, and we are based down Burgess Road (off Way Lane). Children are welcome from aged 2½ to 4 (pre-school year). We offer specialised pre-school sessions on a Monday and Wednesday afternoon from 12.00 till 3.00pm, with sessions for the younger age group (2½ - 3½) from 9.00 till 11.30am on Monday and Wednesday mornings. On Tuesday, Thursday and Friday mornings we hold mixed sessions, which are open to both age groups, from 9.00am till 12.00pm (with optional lunch sessions from 12.00 till 1.00pm at a small extra charge). Thanks to Nursery Funding money from the government, our fees are free to parents from the term after your child is three. Committee members, staff, and parents are always happy to talk about their experiences of the playgroup, and our door is always open to parents wanting to have a look around, just turn up during one of the session times listed above.
